A lack of transportation is one of the biggest challenges for homeless adults trying to rebuild their lives. A reliable bicycle provides a mode of transportation to work, necessary appointments, and support meetings.

Through the Cycles for Change program, Carpenter's Place is partnering with Beloit Bicycle Company to collect donated bikes to be tuned up, cleaned up and sized up for CP quests who are diligently working to change their life. Here's how it works:

Gently-used bikes can be donated dropped off at Carpenter's Place (1149 Railroad Avenue, Rockford) Monday through Friday between 8:30 am and 3:30 pm or by appointment. Bikes will be evaluated, tuned up, and prepared for homeless quests in CP case management who, through hard work and accountability, qualify for a bicycle.

Want to help? We invite you to donate a gently-used bike, lock, helmet or headlight. If you prefer to make a financial donation, a gift of \$40 will purchase a lock, headlight and helmet; or a gift of \$175 will purchase a reliable new bike (retails for \$499).

The Cycles For Change program is made possible by the estate of Merrill Johnson, who had compassion for the homeless and an avid love for biking. By including CP in his estate, Merrill's legacy will live on long after his life as this program will help homeless adults rebuild

their lives by having a source of transportation. If you would like to leave a similar legacy, read about our estate giving program below.

Guest Interaction

- Morning Devotions: Share a brief message of encouragement or special music with our guests at a morning chapel
- Day Room Friends: Be available to listen, talk or pray with guests in the day room
- Meal Providers: Make and serve breakfast or lunch to homeless guests and special holiday meals

No Guest Interaction

- Data Entry: Work with office staff on special projects that require data entry
- Facilities Assistance: Complete basic handyman jobs
- Fund Raising: Work with a committee on fundraising projects or group collection drives to benefit CP

- Donations: Help assist with receiving and processing in-kind donations
- Office Assistance Assist office manager with daily clerical duties
- Group Projects: Complete painting, yard work, and episodic indoor and outdoor projects that are appropriate for a group
- Scavenger Hunt: Go out into the community and collect greatly needed items from our "Needs List." We can supply bags and flyers if you need them
- Snack bags: You or your group can fill snack bags for our guests. We can provide a sheet with appropriate items to include
- Cleaning: Can be done by one person or a group. Clean inside and grounds as needed
