After going through a painful divorce, guest Mike Burton (seen on the right with Employment CM Rob) fell into a deep depression. His life spiraled out of control, and he ended up homeless. For the next 18 months, Mike worked on rebuilding his life. Mike spent a lot of time contemplating what he wanted to do next in life, knowing that he eventually wanted to get back into the working world (he's driven forklifts for over 30 years).

In early June, Mike participated in CP's quarterly job skills course, and the spark was lit! Mike polished up his resume, practiced interviewing, and started searching for jobs. Before long, Mike landed a full-time job as a materials handler with Modern Advanced Manufacturing in Rockford.

Mike went through the most difficult period of his life, but he never gave up. Through tenacity, patience, and determination, Mike has found a job that he loves, and is excited about the next chapter in his life.

A CLOSER LOOK: MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

The CP Mental Health Housing program began in December 2009, designed as a transitional housing program for homeless guests with mental health diagnosis who desire to make a positive change in their lives. Carpenter's Place strives to make the program a safe and supportive home-style environment of like-minded guests, who commit to encourage and support one another in their goal of achieving an independent and positive lifestyle. Carpenter's Place provides support, guidance, and training as needed to enable housing guests to gain strength and stability. The goal for guests is to obtain their own individual, private housing and become productive, independent members of society within 24 months of entering the program.

SUMMER BASH CELEBRATION



On July 27, we held our annual Back to School Summer Bash for our participants in the Family Services Program. It was a fun filled afternoon of fellowship, with games, entertainment, and a cookout. Each child received a backpack with school supplies, clothing, and other items. Each family received a care package with laundry supplies, toiletries, and other essentials.

The Family Services team also use this as an opportunity to educate the families about community resources. We had a presentation from RPS 205 FIT program (Families In Transition), for families experiencing homelessness. Bev Pomering from the LIVE R.E.A.L Foundation shared information about the opioid crisis and Narcan training. Thank you to all of our donors, including the Community Foundation IYWT Board, who helped make this event possible.



YEAR-END MILESTONES

From June 2022 through July 2023:

- **671** Homeless adults came to CP for services
- **33** Families were active in our Family Case Management program (39 adults and 70 children).

We continue to see a surge in homeless adults and families. Our prayer is that we are able to be the hands, feet and heart of Jesus when they walk through our doors.
