Soon, he found CP and became immersed in the program. Ravon got involved in case management, and started meeting regularly with Rob, our employment program coordinator. For the first time in his life, Ravon felt that he had a mentor, and was driven to better himself in all areas of his life. Before long, Ravon started a part-time job at McDonalds. However, he still came into CP on his days off, so that he could continue making progress in his life.

All of Ravon's hard work and persistence paid off...in early May, he started working for a local manufacturer. This is a good paying, full-time position with great benefits and union membership. Ravon feels grateful for the CP community, because he believes that this opened up many doors to him in life.

After his job at the Carnival closed, Jeremiah found himself unemployed and homeless. He came to Carpenter's Place in January feeling discouraged, but with the drive and desire to succeed. Jeremiah started working with case manager Sue on some goals: first obtaining an IL State ID and then working



with Rob, our Employment Specialist, to find a job. He worked hard helping out at CP so we weren't surprised at how quickly he found employment.

In April, Jeremiah got an offer for a full-time position at McDonalds, which he loves and is often found working extra hours. While attending a program at another agency, he began helping the Security Guard, who was short staffed. As a result, Jeremiah has been invited to attend paid security guard training.

Jeremiah continues to come to CP daily to shower, grab some breakfast, have his laundry done, and most importantly continue to meet with his case manager on setting new goals. Recently he began looking at apartments and has a goal of moving in by the end of May. CP is so proud of Jeremiah and all that he has accomplished in less than 6 months!
