WE LOVE OUR GROUP VOLUNTEERS!

CP is grateful for the churches, organizations and businesses who give of their time. Whether volunteering for on-site projects or holding a drive, the support is critical to meeting our mission! Some group volunteer opportunities are:

- **Serve a meal for our guests**
 - CP offers -breakfast (for 40 – 60 people) and lunch (for 80 to 100 people) Monday through Friday. We are always looking for people to plan, purchase and serve a meal. There are always open dates to fill!
- **Projects at our Housing Units**
 - As we head into Spring, we have 3 housing units that can use some yard work (weeding, planting, spreading mulch). Your group can just sign up to do the work, or sign up to purchase some of the items needed (small shrubs, flowers, mulch) or both. Additionally, a fresh coat of paint for the units is always a need!
- **Saturday Morning at Railroad**
 - While we have no guests, there are always little projects that can be done. Some examples are: Rolling silverware, sorting items, organizing spaces, putting together goodie bags for the guests, painting and more.
- **Hold a Drive for Current Needs**
 - No matter the season, there are always staples we need for our guests. We can give you a handful of needed items (in all price ranges) for a collection drive.
